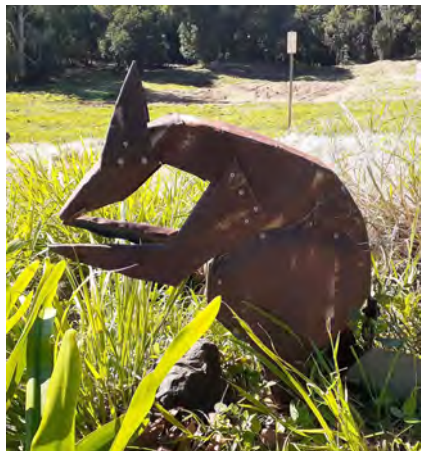

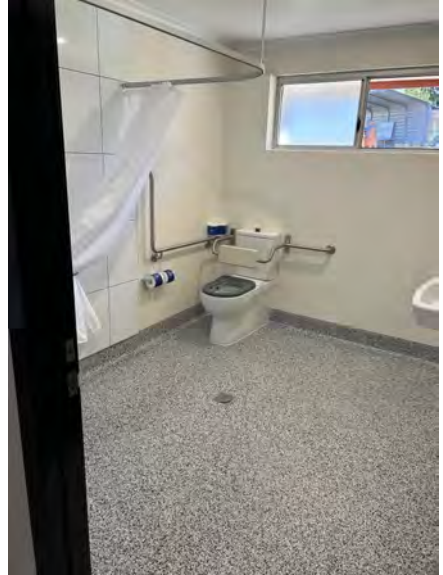
QCCC MAPLETON WEEKLY ACTIVITY

It seems last weekend's group certainly did get out and about in town quite a bit. Hopefully they contributed a good cash injection to local businesses and the markets! This weekend we are hosting a Grade 11 Leadership Camp from a large Brisbane School. At the start of next week, Grade 4 is the name of the game. We will be receiving Grade 4 cohorts from three different Brisbane schools, which means our modified Flying Fox for younger children will be in significant demand. It will be a busy changeover day on Wednesday with 450 students overlapping onsite for lunch. Two schools will be arriving, one a composite Grade 5/6 Camp from Brisbane and the other a Grade 5 Camp from the Gold Coast.

Accessibility Upgrade

QCCC Mapleton is a very popular campsite for Special Schools and People with Disability so we have recently been mindful of how any site upgrades can improve accessibility for all campers.

Last year we were able to refurbish our General Ablutions block near the Pools Complex and include an all-access bathroom. However, we have lacked for a modern all-access bathroom near our dining room and courtyard, as well as one close to a bedroom. We have two bedrooms coming off our courtyard area and we have recently refurbished their bathroom into a modern and best-practice all-access bathroom. It is going to make a huge difference to guests with accessibility needs.

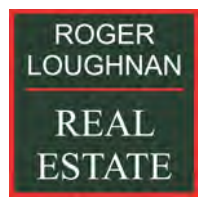

SCARLET HONEYEATER

Myzomela sanguinolenta

The adult male scarlet honeyeater is a vivid scarlet red and black bird with white underparts. The females and immature birds are dull brown with dull white underparts and a reddish wash on the chin. In both sexes the tail is relatively short, the bill strongly curved, and the eye is dark. This species is a small honeyeater, usually seen alone or in pairs, but occasionally in flocks, high in trees.

Males have a silvery tinkling song, which is sung from a prominent perch. Also, 'chiew chiew' contact calls made by both sexes. The scarlet honeyeater is found along the east coast of Australia, from Cooktown, Queensland to Gippsland, Victoria, being a summer migrant in the south. It is also found in Sulawesi, the Moluccas and Lesser Sundas, Indonesia and in New Caledonia.

The Scarlet Honeyeater occurs in a wide range of forest habitats, but is most common in open eucalypt forests and woodlands, especially those that grow near wetlands. They are frequently observed in flowering shrubs, and can be spotted in urban areas where people have planted bottlebrushes and other nectar-rich species.

While it can be a little elusive as it flits around the blossom and dense foliage of trees on the edges of rainforest and gardens, once spied it is not easily forgotten, especially the males with their brilliant combo of red, white and black.

KANGAROO PAW

Kangaroo paws are among the most iconic Australian plants, instantly recognisable by their unique furry and vibrantly coloured flowers. One of the best known is Western Australia's floral emblem, the Red and Green Kangaroo Paw (*Anigozanthos manglesii*) or try the tall orange yellow species.

There are several species and many hybrids available, so you can grow kangaroo paw in most climates and soil types. Keep to the species as they seem to be stronger and adapt well to the Sunshine Coast Hinterland and the Range.

Steps for Kangaroo Paw Success

- Choose a species or variety that will perform well in your area such as 'Big Red'.
- Select an open sunny position for growing kangaroo paw.
- Good drainage is essential as kangaroo paws do not like wet feet – a gravelly soil, light loam or well-draining potting mix is best for growing kangaroo paw.
- Don't overwater kangaroo paw– the occasional drink over a long hot summer is all that's needed.
- Feed kangaroo paw with a low phosphorus fertiliser suitable for native plants in spring and late summer.

A weed in Queensland

This is a fast growing shrub from South Africa, which grows to 2m tall. It can reach greater heights if supported amongst other plants but can also be pruned into a hedge. It has masses of sky blue flowers in dense clusters in the warmer months. It is prone to producing masses of suckers.

HOW IT SPREADS

Small branches can re-establish a new plant as small roots quickly take hold in new surroundings.

The seeds are sticky and adhere to the fur of animals and to your clothing.

Plant instead: Blue Salvia, Salvia 'Blue Mound', Coastal Rosemary *Westringia* 'Wynyabbie Gem'

The Australian Terrier is descended from the rough coated type terriers brought from Great Britain to Australia in the early 19th century. The ancestral types of all of these breeds were kept to eradicate mice and rats. The Australian Terrier shares ancestors with the Cairn Terrier, Shorthaired Skye Terrier, and the Dandie Dinmont

Terrier; Yorkshire Terriers and Irish Terriers were also crossed into the dog during the breed's development.

Development of the breed began in Australia about 1820, and the dogs were at first called the Rough Coated Terrier. The breed was officially recognised in 1850, and later renamed as the Australian Terrier in 1892. The Australian Terrier was shown at a dog show for the first time in 1906 in Melbourne, and was also shown in Great Britain about the same time.

KOALAS

Breeding season

The breeding season for koalas is from August to February. This is a time of increased movement for koalas.

Report koala sightings

If you find sick or injured koala, call 1300 ANIMAL (1300 264625). Or for a local contact—see below.

Ways you can help when koalas are on the move and breeding

- drive carefully and look out for koalas crossing roads from dawn until dusk
- contain your dog at night and provide them with wildlife avoidance skills to protect koalas
- contact your nearest wildlife rescue or 1300 ANIMAL for QLD if you come across a sick or injured koala
- consider koala-friendly fencing options. If you have a fence that may prevent koalas from accessing safe habitat, consider adding a simple escape route such as a timber post positioned at an angle to the fence. This allows koalas to climb over the fence and escape danger.
- make your pool koala-safe by ensuring you have safe escape options such as a rope in the pool.

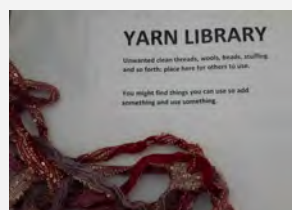
