HUMANITARIAN SPIRIT OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA

What an amazing evening. With the Mens Shed hosting and Blackall Range Lions organising it was a great community gathering and a very successful fundraiser. Despite the rain during Peter's talk – which seemed like a little PNG reality, the donations, raffles and auction of PNG artefacts was not dampened by the 75 people who attended. More the \$13,500 was raised to help remote villages on the Ghost Mountain Trail and having modified being and education. get basic medical help and education. Here are some audience comments:



I had no idea these men at 20 odd years of age were so involved in governing PNG. IN the 1960's Col was in some of the remotest parts of the country. His anecdotes of trying to bring law and order to tribes who had barely seen white people were captivating. Stories of gruesome rituals, and in particular the suspected murder of Col's local Constable Okomba kept the audience enthralled. Col's love of PNG and the lasting impression it left on him was your obvious

PNG and the lasting impression it left on him was very obvious. We are lucky to have such people in our community.



John had such an amazing career and a huge responsibility over vast areas of PNG. He made us realise how little we actually knew, and how complex the situation was in PNG then (1960's and 1970's), and now. The many short stories of John's exploits especially to some of the

more warlike villages and how their differences were resolved were absolutely fascinating. John obviously feels strongly for PNG and treasures the 16 years he spent there during which time he was married and started a family.



The first being the organisation of a documentary to provide a historical record of the Flying Dutchman tragedy. This requires great conviction and effort. My respect for Peter grew as he showed photos of the villagers along the Ghost Mountain Trail who he has treated in the past with basic medication he carried with him. Peter's concern for these villagers was very clear. It led to his determination to raise funds to provide


a medical facility for the villagers where they currently have nothing. This is a truly humanitarian project.


BEHIND THE SCENES – QCCC MAPLETON'S KITCHEN TEAM

Whether it's a hearty meal after a day in the bush or a carefully prepared plate for a child with allergies, every dish is an opportunity to serve with excellence and compassion.








Downton Abbey: The Grand Finale






Our members have been potting up tried & true plants from our gardens. Also making heaps of produce and yummy home made jams, pickles & baked goods.


Nurseries & exhibitors from SE Qld, food & coffee vendors, country style morning & afternoon teas.

Grow Australian Plants

Hakea actites

Wallum hakea

A hardy erect multi branched shrub to 3m tall with long needle like foliage. The white to pink flowers are in axillary clusters and observed in winter to spring.

The unusual, sharp pointed, woody seedpods grow to around 3.5cm in length.

Prefers full sun to part shade and will grow on the light forest soils along the Blackall Range.

This species is found in swampy locations in coastal areas from around Hervey Bay in south east Queensland to a little north of Coffs Harbour in New South Wales.

This species provides protection, nesting sites and nectar for small birds due to its prickly habit and profuse flowering. Attracts bees.

In full flower across the region.

Platycercus adscitus subspecies palliceps





General description: Quiet, partially blue parrot with white to pale yellow head. Variable colouration, mostly on breast, back and rump so that some populations and individuals are dull, others exquisitely bright. Usually found in pairs in foliage, grasses or on ground but will gather as small flocks around spilt grain.

Habitat: Forests, woodlands with light timber, grasslands, cleared areas near water, towns.

Male: Head, crown and nape white to pale yellow. Cheeks white or violet-blue (usually lack blue in local populations). Eyes dark brown. Bill pale grey. Back usually yellow with black mottling. Rump pale blue or blue-green. Wings mostly blue with yellow and black mottling, underwings blue forward, dark grey rearwards. Tail blue. Chin white or cream. Throat white, grading to pale blue. Breast blue. Vent red patch extending to upper tail. Legs and feet grey.

Female: Similar, but usually slightly duller than male, underwings have one row of white spots.

Juvenile: Duller; has double row of underwing spots. Head speckled red.

Flight: Fast, direct, undulating as wing beats and short glides alternate with holding wings against body. Pale head obvious during flight; red patch under tail visible when landing or taking off.

Call: During flight gives a harsh 'kwink kwink'. Repeated tinkling whistles when at rest, usually 5 notes or just 2 'ning ning...', chatters and scolds when interacting with other birds.

Feeding: On ground or in foliage, seed (e.g. *Grevillea*) and berries, also insects and their larvae.

Breeding: Nest hole in tree or stump. **Eggs** 3-7, white. **Breeding season** August to January, also after rains.

Groundsel bush


Baccharis halimifolia

Groundsel Bush is native to the eastern coast of North America and the West Indies.

Category 3 Restricted Matter (Biosecurity Act 2014)

An upright bushy shrub (1-3m tall) with much-branched stems that become woody with age. Its waxy leaves (2.5-7.0cm long and 1-4cm wide) have coarsely toothed margins. It produces separate male and female flowerheads on separate plants. The male flower heads are cream to yellow, while the female flower heads are white.

Groundsel bush is regarded as a significant environmental weed in Queensland and



This species is of most concern in subtropical melaleuca wetlands, where it can form a dense understorey that suppresses the growth of native sedges and interferes with the natural ecosystem. It can also become abundant in native vegetation along watercourses and in coastal woodlands and forests. Conservation areas are also under threat from invasion by this species, and it has invaded several reserves in Queensland (e.g. Noosa National Park, Maroochy River Conservation Park and Pimpama River Conservation Area) and New South Wales (e.g. Ballina Nature Reserve, Wooyung Nature Reserve and Cullendulla National Park).



LONG LISTEN FESTIVAL 2025

3-6 October

The Long Listen Festival returns to the Sunshine Coast Hinterland with four days of music, conversation, and community. Presented across Palmwoods and Mapleton, this boutique festival brings together 56 artists in 14 events spanning 11 genres, from chamber, classical and experimental to world, folk, blues, and bluegrass cultural experiences.

The festival opens on Friday 3 October with an intimate Welcome Dinner at Homegrown Café, followed by a powerful Opening Night Concert, Migrating Bird, featuring Véronique Serret and band with special guest William Barton. Other highlights include Ensemble Q, Courtenay Cleary and Alex Raineri in recital, our Appalachian Spring Gala featuring a festival commission world premiere by Queensland composer Nicole Murphy, and Blues on the Range with State of Appalachia and Hat Fitz & Cara.

Audiences can expect spellbinding concerts, genre-bending collaborations, sound journeys, author conversations, and cultural immersions, set in small halls and community spaces curated and programmed by Louise King, cellist and founder.


