We advise residents of an upcoming rock blast scheduled to occur at Dulong Quarry.

On the scheduled day of the blast, please ensure adequate measures are in place for household occupants, animals and livestock.

We appreciate your understanding as we work to ensure the safe and efficient operation of Dulong Quarry.

Vibration and noise information

Ground vibration and air overpressure (noise) may occur from blasting activities. We apply best practice blasting techniques to minimise disturbance where possible.

Noise limitations are specified by Environmentally Relevant Authority (ERA) Permit EPPR00777413 issued by the Department of Environment and Science.

Council's qualified blasting contractors operate within compliance guidelines set by the Department of Environment and Science for conditions of environmental authorities issued under the Environmental Protection Act 1994.

About Council's quarries

Sunshine Coast Council's quarries are located at Image Flat and Dulong. Image Flat quarry has been in operation since the 1960s, and Dulong since the 1970s.

Rock product is extracted from Image Flat and Dulong quarry sites through blasting activities using explosives to break the rock. Today these quarries supply premium quality rock products for the construction, maintenance and repair of the region's 2597km of sealed roads and 474km of unsealed roads.

Blasting is undertaken by qualified service providers to extract rock product for supply to Council projects, road maintenance and external commercial contractors.




Identifying Rainforest Plants of the Blackall Range: the Rainforest Ancients

Saturday, 4 October, 9am - 11am Barung Landcare Native Plant Nursery, Parkland Drive, North Maleny

Our Blackall Range rainforests contain species with ancient lineages. We know well our gymnosperms such as bunya pine, hoop pine and brown pine, ancient groups represented in the fossils of Antarctica. But the very early groups of flowering plants are also thriving in our forests, trees, vines and herbs with primitive flowers, strange pollination systems, and interesting smells! These include the bolwarra, zigzag vine, socketwood, wilkiea, the birdwing butterfly vine, and the delicate peperomias with their minute flowers, and others. What are the characteristics of these ancient groups?

Did you know that the Red Tulip is the international symbol for Parkinson's Awareness? The tulip represents hope, perseverance and effort to find a cure for Parkinson's.


Mapleton now has a Self Help Support group established to support people who have been diagnosed as living with Parkinson's and their carers and/or support persons.

GREEN LIGHT FOR GRASSROOTS ENVIRONMENTAL GRANTS

Community groups across Mapleton and the hinterland are being encouraged to apply for the State Government's Grassroots Environmental Grants, with funding now available to support local projects aimed at protecting and preserving our environment.

The program provides annual funding rounds to back small but impactful initiatives in towns, rural centres, and cities right across the state.

Member for Nicklin Marty Hunt said the grants deliver \$800,000 to support local, community-led conservation efforts.

"We've got many community groups who are already rolling up their sleeves to protect our incredible natural environment," Mr Hunt said.

"Groups can apply for up to \$15,000 for equipment purchases or facility upgrades to boost their capability and reach, and up to \$30,000 for on-ground conservation projects such as revegetation, habitat restoration, and native species protection."

Applications for Round 1: Environmental Conservation close at 4pm, Wednesday 8 October 2025.

"The strength of this program is that it's designed for grassroots groups - it's about locals making a difference right here in our own backyard," he said.

"If you've been thinking about a project to restore habitat, protect native species, or improve sustainability, now is the time to get your application in."



Grow Australian Plants LOCAL

Hibbertia vestita

Hairy guinea flower

Hibbertia vestita is a small rounded shrub, with compact growth of around 30 cm high and 40-50 cm wide. It is a fairly sturdy little plant with fairly stiff stems of very small, short, blunt leaves, and both stems and leaves are covered with minute hairs.

The yellow flowers are usually seen in spring.

Its natural habitats vary; it is common in both the Wallum wetlands and the drier high dunes along the east coast. It is plentiful in the understorey of scribbly gum (*Eucalyptus racemosa*) open forests on coastal sands and the sandstones of montane heaths.

Distribution: From Rockhampton in Queensland to central eastern New South Wales.







Chestnut-breasted Mannikin

Lonchura castaneothorax



11-12cm

The Chestnut-breasted Mannikin is a thick set brown finch with a grey crown, black face and a heavy grey bill. It has a chestnut brown breast divided from white underparts by a black bar. The rump and tail are golden orange, with a black undertail.



Females are paler than males and young birds are uniformly olive brown above, pale below with a brown buff chest and no black face or chest bar. Like other finches, this species is a very social bird and is most often seen in flocks.



Distribution: The Chestnut-breasted Mannikin is found across northern and eastern coastal Australia, from the Kimberley region, Northern Territory, to the Shoalhaven River, New South Wales. It is also found in New Guinea.


Habitat: The Chestnut-breasted Mannikin is found in reed beds, long grasses, swamps and mangroves.

Seasonal movements: Locally nomadic, especially in the north. Can form flocks of several hundred birds.

Feeding: The Chestnut-breasted Mannikin feeds on grass seeds, usually on the stalk rather than from the ground. It will also eat winged termites at the beginning of breeding season.

Breeding: The Chestnut-breasted Mannikin nests in colonies, with the nests close together in grass clumps, sugar cane or reeds, less than 2 m from the ground. The rounded nest is made from green or dried grass blades and is lined with fine grasses. It lacks an entrance tunnel but the entrance may have a hood. Both parents build the nest, incubate the eggs and feed the young, but only the female stays in the nest overnight.

Ochna, Mickey Mouse plant

Ochna serrulata

Native to Southern Africa

Ochna is an extremely hardy plant, capable of growing in harsh, dry conditions. It is difficult to kill, especially larger specimens. It can grow to 4 metres in situations where it is supported by other plants, but mostly grows to about 2 metres.

Has rough pimply textured bark. Its alternately arranged leaves are narrowly oval or elongated and have finely toothed margins. Its bright yellow flowers (2-3cm across) have five petals, five sepals and numerous stamens. The sepals are initially green, but they turn bright red as the fruit develop. The small fruit (5-8 mm long) turn from green to black as they mature.

Ochna is a significant environmental weed in Queensland and New South Wales, and is regarded as a potential environmental weed or "sleeper weed" in other parts of Australia.





Note to this week's report:

Firstly, an explanation: **Impact Assessable vs Code Assessable** - Code assessable development is typically straightforward and complies with local planning codes, not requiring public notification. In contrast, impact assessable development involves a more detailed review process, including public notification and community input, due to its potential impacts on the surrounding area. Typically, under code assessment, if the application is correctly made, is appropriate to the zone it is situated in, and addresses positively the defined outcomes of the code, and does not contravene any specially defined overlay, the application will succeed.

This specific report highlights the inconsistencies present in terms of applying assessment levels, Code or Impact, to applications. Of particular note, MCU25/0258 relates to an application for dual living on a 700m2 lot. The application is regarded as **impact** assessable. Creates the potential for 2 families on 700m2. MCU25/0262 is a large (675m2) sales outlet, in commercial Nambour, gabled with landscaped car parking. Again, this application is **impact** assessable.

However, less than 500M from MCU25/0262 is MCU25/0256, which will create a 6 level apartment complex with 152 apartments, which are designated "rooming". They contain no kitchen per say, and the living area, (bedroom, lounge, laundry in a cupboard etc), of each is 27.55m2 excluding balconies. Such a development has the potential to change the character of Nambour on various levels. Yet the development is deemed to be code assessable.

The last call for submissions to the new planning scheme is midnight 19th September 2025.


