QCCC MAPLETON WEEKLY UPDATE

This week wraps up with a shift in rhythm, as Friday's pupil-free day has seen our school groups head home a little earlier than usual. That's made space for a three-night Church Youth and Family Camp over the weekend. Expect some lively action around the ovals and recreational spaces, and the sound of amplified music in Kirkwood Hall as families and youth connect in community and worship.

Next week, schools return in big numbers:

- From Monday to Wednesday, we're hosting two Grade 5 camps—one from the Sunshine Coast and another from Brisbane's Southside.
- On Wednesday, three more groups arrive for the second half of the week:
 - * A Grade 4 camp from Brisbane,
 - * Another Grade 5 group from Brisbane,
 - * And a Grade 6 cohort from the Darling Downs.

With students ranging from Year 4 to Year 6, it'll be a vibrant week full of discovery, play, and personal growth.

Survival Camp Spotlight – The Power of the Solo

While the Mapleton site buzzes with activity, another large-scale program will be unfolding offsite at our Cobb and Co Campgrounds near Gympie. Here, we'll be running a four-night Survival Camp for Grade 9 students from one of our largest partner schools.

A standout feature of this program is the 24-hour solo experience—a rite of passage that invites students into deep personal reflection in nature. Thanks to the exclusive access and extensive property layout at Cobb and Co, we've created a network of private, peaceful "nooks and crannies" that allow each participant to have their own safe and uninterrupted time in the bush.

Why does solo time matter?

Research into outdoor learning has shown that solo experiences in nature offer profound developmental benefits:

- They reduce stress and build inner calm
- Enhance self-awareness and emotional regulation
- Strengthen students' ability to reflect, listen, and observe
- Encourage personal responsibility and resilience
- Deepen spiritual and emotional insight in ways group settings may not

Our instructors prepare students thoroughly for this time, and the results are consistently remarkable. Quiet, stillness, and solitude can be rare gifts in the life of a teenager—and we're grateful to provide a space where young people can engage with creation and themselves at a deeper level.

Grow Australian Plants

***Westringia* 'Zena'**

Coast rosemary

APPEARANCE: Compact shrub with dense grey green foliage and small white flowers throughout most of the year.

USE FOR: Hedging and borders; native gardens; suitable for exposed areas and coastal locations. Will also thrive in a large pot.

PLANTING: Hardy shrub suited to most conditions. Full sun to part shade in the garden. Plant in a well draining soil rich in organic matter.

CARE: Mulch and water well, prune to promote new growth and compact habit. Requires little water once established.

Size: 1m tall x 1 m spread

The parent of *Westringia* 'Zena' is *Westringia fruticose*, a NSW species.

Currently in flower in a Mapleton garden.

Attracts native bees.

ROYAL SPOONBILL

Platalea regia

LOCAL

The Royal Spoonbill, also called the Black-billed Spoonbill, has recently been seen at the Lilyponds in Mapleton. It is common throughout northern and eastern Australia but rare in Tasmania. It also occurs in Indonesia, New Guinea and New Zealand. It is a wading bird that inhabits coastal and inland shallow waters, large or small, marine or fresh.

It is a large waterbird, 75-80 cm long and distinguished by its snowy white plumage, long straight black bill with a spoon-shaped tip and black legs and feet. Its forehead has a red patch while the front of its head is black and naked with warts. The eyes are red with a yellow patch above them. The sexes are similar although the females are slightly smaller with slightly shorter legs and bill.

Breeding birds have long (20 cm) white plumes extending from their hind crown and are often wind-blown and untidy. Also, their breast is covered with a buff wash.

They feed in water less than 40 cm deep by walking and sweeping their partly opened, highly sensitive bill, in broad arcs side to side to detect and grasp prey, then throwing their head back to swallow it. They eat fish, crustaceans, molluscs and aquatic insects.

Breeding occurs Oct-May, singly or in loose colonies together with Ibises, Darters and small Cormorants, in a shallow nest of sticks built on bushes or in a tree up to 9 m, generally above water.

WEED

Duranta erecta

A slightly spiny upright shrub with drooping branches. Its oppositely arranged leaves are sometimes toothed towards their tips. Its blue or light purple (occasionally white) tubular flowers are borne in elongated clusters. It is most easily distinguished by its large clusters of yellow orange mature fruit.

It is regarded as an environmental weed in Queensland and northern New South Wales.

It was recently listed among the top 50 most invasive species in the New South Wales North Coast environmental weed survey and among the top 100 most invasive plants in south east Queensland.

It is also regarded as a "sleepers weed" in other parts of Australia and is listed as an undesirable plant in the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area in northern Queensland. This species invades moist or wet sites in native bushland areas, and is particularly common along river banks and in riparian zones.

An infestation was recently reported to be climbing 10m up into the existing canopy of an at risk regional ecosystem near Townsville in northern Queensland. Duranta is also listed as an important invasive plant in China, where it causes obvious changes in natural ecosystems, and it is on the list of the most invasive horticultural plants in Hawaii.
