Mapleton Cemetery Upgrade

The Sunshine Coast Council has committed to a fully-funded \$32,000 upgrade for the Mapleton Cemetery located on Delicia Road. The project is entering its practical delivery stages, focusing on a major enhancement to the site's niche wall.

Specific details of the current development include:

Niche Wall Overhaul: The primary feature of the upgrade is the installation of a protective granite veneer on the existing niche wall.

Design and Material: Following community consultation, project managers have obtained final stone quotes and are considering a high-quality grey-toned granite finish for the wall.

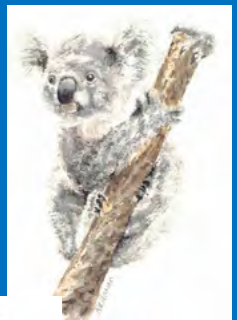

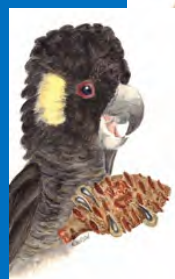

Introducing AusAlert™

and the AusAlert national test

Monday 27 July 2026

The Australian Government is launching AusAlert, a new national warning system that can send emergency messages to compatible mobile devices in times of disaster.

AusAlert will be ready to use in October 2026, but before it launches, we need to test the system across Australia.

On **Monday 27 July**, your mobile devices, such as mobile phones, tablets and smart watches, may receive a test alert. The notification will vibrate and include a loud siren-like sound that lasts about 10 seconds. If this could disrupt you or cause you or a loved one to feel unsafe, please turn off your mobile devices or switch them to aeroplane mode before the scheduled test time in your location, and leave them off for at least one hour.

As this is just a test, you don't need to do anything, but in an actual disaster you should follow the alert instructions to keep yourself and others safe.

On Monday 27 July 2026 at 2:00 pm (Queensland time), a test Critical Alert will be sent to mobile devices across Australia as part of the national testing of the new AusAlert emergency warning system. Devices may vibrate and emit a siren-like warning sound for approximately 10 seconds, followed by a message clearly identifying the alert as a test.

Key messages:
The alert is only a test and no action is required.

Most mobile phones, and some smart watches and tablets, are expected to receive the test alert.

Not everyone will receive the alert at the same time, and some devices may not receive it at all. This is expected and is one of the reasons for conducting the national test.

People who may be distressed or disrupted by the alert can avoid receiving it by switching their device off or placing it in aeroplane mode before the test and leaving it off for at least one hour.

Grow Australian Plants

LOCAL

Hovea acutifolia

Fast growing upright shrub to 1.5m with hairy brown stems and long narrow leaves.

Purple pea flowers in late winter to early spring. The white form is rare.

Prefers sun to part shade locations on well drained soils, preferring moist locations.

Attracts bees.

Occurs in south east Queensland to the central coast of New South Wales.

Currently flowering across the region.





Emerald Dove

Squat ground-dwelling dove with shimmering green wings. Note chocolate-brown body. Found in forest and forest edge, where it forages on the ground; often flushed at close quarters with a loud wing-clatter. Usually solitary, occasionally in flocks or small groups. Song is an accelerating and rising series of mournful coos.

Emerald doves are usually observed alone, in pairs or small groups. They are quite terrestrial, often foraging on the ground for fallen fruit, seeds and a wide variety of low-lying plants. They will spend little time in trees, except when roosting!

Emerald doves are often preyed upon by domestic cats and dogs, reptiles and foxes. They are currently considered a species of least concern.

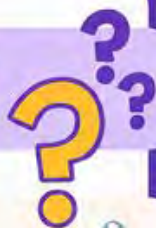
