25th anniversary of Australian
service in **Afghanistan** 2001-2021



Afghanistan

Australian forces were deployed to Afghanistan in 2001 under Operation Slipper, contributing to the International Security Assistance Force — a multinational mission to combat terrorism and stabilise and reconstruct the country.

Over the following two decades, more than 35,000 Australians served in Afghanistan or in support roles across the Middle East Area of Operations.

The Australian War Memorial's Roll of Honour records 47 Australian Defence Force personnel who died as a result of their service in Afghanistan, with a further 263 Australians wounded.

The 25th anniversary commemoration offers all Australians an opportunity to express their respect and gratitude to those who put themselves in harm's way.

On Sunday 11th October the Mapleton RSL Sub-branch will hold a memorial service at 9:00 am in the Memorial park to commemorate those who served in the Afghanistan Campaign. Following the service the Mapleton Public House has opened the Green Room to screen the Australian War Memorial Service which will commence at **10:00 am**. All community members are welcome to attend.

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Held over National Bird Week from 19-25 October, the Aussie Bird Count is Australia's biggest citizen science event.

Every year, tens of thousands of Australians of all ages and experiences join us in observing and counting the birds we live with.

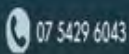

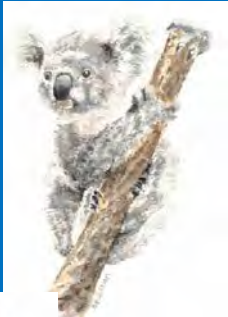

Grow Australian Plants

Hibbertia vestita ***Hairy guinea flower***

Distribution: From Rockhampton in Queensland to central-eastern New South Wales.

Hibbertia is a genus of around 150 species (though this may increase following botanical revision), most of which occur naturally in Australia. They are generally small to medium shrubs with yellow, buttercup-like flowers.

Hibbertia vestita is a small rounded shrub, with compact growth of around 30 cm high and 40–50 cm wide.

It is a fairly sturdy little plant with fairly stiff stems of very small, short, blunt leaves, and both stems and leaves are covered with minute hairs.

Its natural habitats vary; it is common in both the Wallum Wetlands and the drier high dunes along the east coast. It is plentiful in the understorey of scribbly gum (*Eucalyptus racemosa*) open forests on coastal sands and the sandstones of montane heaths.

Flowers are usually seen in early spring.
Currently flowering across the region.



Wompoo fruit-dove ***Ptilinopus magnificus***

One of the more spectacular species of fruit-dove in Australia, the wompoo fruit-dove has largely green upper parts, while its breast is plum purple, and the belly and underwings are canary yellow.

Despite this bright colouration, wompoo fruit-doves are often overlooked as they forage on fruit among the leaves high in the canopy of tropical and subtropical rainforests. Often the first sign that they are there is the sound of fruit falling onto the forest floor below. Another tell tale sign is their call, a distinctive 'wompoo', which gives the bird its name.

The wompoo fruit-dove is identified by its large size, rich purple throat, chest and upper belly, and yellow lower belly. It has mostly green upperparts, with a paler grey head and a conspicuous yellow wing-bar.

It is perhaps the most beautiful of all the doves found in Australia, and both sexes are similar in plumage. Birds from the north are smaller than those in the south. Young wompoos are duller and greener than the adults.

Keeping our children safe

As parents and carers, knowing who may have access to our children matters.

More than 400,000 Queenslanders have accessed Daniel's Law since it launched eight months ago to give families another tool to help make informed decisions about their children's safety.

In just eight months there have been:

- 405,330 visits to the Daniel's Law website
- 46,428 local area searches
- 231 parent and guardian disclosure applications
- Three paedophiles charged for allegedly breaching their reporting obligations.



Daniel's Law gives parents and carers access to important information about reportable child sex offenders in their community, helping families make informed choices about who has contact with their children.

It's a significant step forward for child safety in Queensland and an important part of Daniel Morcombe's legacy. **I thank Bruce and Denise Morcombe for their extraordinary and tireless advocacy for stronger child protection.**

Intersections & Roading upgrades

Nambour Connection Road: Planning investigations are complete for upgrades at the Nambour Connection Road and Diddillibah Road intersection, with traffic signals at Diddillibah Road and Blackall Street now the preferred solution. With more than 24,000 vehicles using the road each day, the upgrade will improve safety, intersection capacity and traffic flow. Design is now underway, with the community invited to view the planning layout and provide feedback to help shape the final design. [Have your say before October 2](#)

Ilkley Road Overpass update:

Following the bridge strike in February, design work for the permanent repairs to the Ilkley Road overpass is progressing, with construction to follow. The overpass reopened in April under restrictions, including a 5-tonne load limit, 2.5-metre width restriction and single-lane operation. Monitoring equipment remains in place. TMR will continue to monitor the structure and provide the community with further updates as construction approaches.

Cooroy & Palmwoods Intersections: Concept plans for both Cooroy and Palmwoods intersections will be made public very soon. I know many locals are keen to see these designs and I'm looking forward to hearing your feedback. Please keep an eye on my [social media](#) and your emails for updates. We also update the Intersection Updates page on my [website](#) frequently.

Pedestrian Safety in Mapleton & Kenilworth: A few months ago, I sought community feedback on pedestrian safety in Mapleton and Kenilworth. Thank you to everyone who took the time to share their views. I have since discussed the feedback with the TMR planning team and am continuing to work through the potential options. I hope to provide a further update on the next steps soon.

Traffic signal upgrades for Nambour: Important works are due to begin at the intersection of Nambour Connection Road (Coronation Avenue), Currie Street and Price Street to replace ageing traffic signal infrastructure. Most work will take place at night to minimise disruption, with works expected to take around two to four months. Motorists may experience temporary lane closures and delays, while nearby residents and businesses may experience some noise and vibration. Thank you in advance for your patience while these important upgrades are completed to help keep the intersection safe and reliable.
